Below is a list of the courses that have been approved for transfer from Alexandria Technical and Community College and how they match up with Concordia's CORE curriculum requirements. If a course that you are looking for is not listed below it does not mean that it will not transfer. After you are accepted for admission at Concordia you will receive an official transcript evaluation from our Registrar's Office. This will give you a clear idea on where you stand in relation to our graduation requirements. It should be noted that this is a *guide* only for the purpose of helping you in course selection for transferring to Concordia. Below are additional guidelines and resources.

- Courses with grades of C- or higher will transfer.
- All courses equivalent to courses we offer will transfer.
- Courses that we do not offer will transfer as elective credit.
